These therefore are to authorize and require thee forthwith to resurvey or cause to be resurvey'd unto the said Andrew Hamilton within the said County where he has already obtained a survey on the same the said Quantity of five hundred acres and the addition of such vacant Land as is left between the adjoining surveys and make returne thereof into the Secretary's Office in order for a further Confirmation for which this shall be thy sufficient warrant Given under my Hand and the lesser Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the first day of the third month (May) Anno. Dni 1733.
