By the Commissioners of Property.

In pursuance of an agreement made by us about five years since with divers persons of this City of Philadelphia for ye better Improvement of Several quantities of that vacant Swamp and Cripple which lies between ye Lands of Moyamensing Wickaco & Delaware River, These are to authorize and Require thee to Survey unto Andrew Hamilton of the said City Gent. that part of ye sd Swamp or Cripple which lies between ye sd River & ye East side of a Road as now designed to be laid out from the said City to ye point in ye said Swamp or Cripple on Delaware opposite to ye Town of Gloucester in West Jersey & between ye mouth of little Hollanders Creek to ye Southward & the line w^{ch} Divides this from ye Governour's Swamp & Cripple containing about fifty five acres To hold to ye said Andrew Hamilton his Heirs & assigns forever upon his paying to the Trustees of his Province ten Shillings Money of ye same for every acre thereof and after the rate of one Shilling Sterling for one Hundred acres as a yearly quitrent forever, upon this further Condition nevertheless that ye said Andrew Hamilton his Heirs or assigns shall within ye space of seven years next ensuing after ye date hereof well & sufficiently Bank & Drain ye said piece of ground intended to be hereby granted so as to make the same fit for Pasture or Mowing. Given under our Hands & ye lesser Seal of ye Province at Philad^a ye 20th day of ye 12^{mo} (Feb) Anno Di 1719.
