

By virtue of a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property bearing date the thirtieth day of September 1713 I surveyd and Laid out on the fifth day of October 1713 unto Clement Plumstead, George Fitzwater and Israel Pemberton a slip of land off the Manor of Springetsbery (adjoyning to a tract purchased by them of Daniel Pegg) Beginning at a stump of a Gum tree fall and running west by north into the said Manor ten perches to a corner post Thence north by east by the (~~Remainder of the~~) said Manor One hundred and eighteen Pches to a corner post Then South seventy two degrees east by Abraham Bickleys Land ten Pches to a corner post Then by the said other land of the said ^{Clem + George} Plumstead Fitzwater and Pemberton south by west one hundred and sixteen Pches to the place of Begin^g Containing seven acres and one quarter of an acres
