Upon an agreement made with Clement Plumsted of the City of Philad<sup>a</sup> Merch<sup>t</sup> These are to authorise and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said Clement Plumsted a certain piece of Land Lying within our Manor of Springetsbury between the Land called Bush Hill belonging to Andrew Hamilton on the South and the Road that leads from Wissechickon High Road through the said Manor to the River Schuylkill on the north and also between the Land Late Abraham Bickley's now belonging to the said Clement on the East and a line to be continued from the north west corner of Bush hill to the aforesaid Road leading to Schuylkill on the west supposed to contain about eighteen acres To be holden of us our Heirs & Successors for the Term of Thirty One years to commence from the first day of the first mo. (March) Last past Under the yearly Rent of One Shilling Sterling Money of England for every acre thereof and make return of the same into our secretarys office for which this shall be thy sufficient warrant Given under my Hand and the Lesser Seal of Our Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> this 2<sup>d</sup> day of ye 6<sup>th</sup> mo. (Aug<sup>t</sup>) A. D. 1734.
