These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed for our use the Front and High Street Lots of Ground in the City of Philadelphia and the proportion of Liberty land within the Liberties thereof appurtenant and belonging to the Original purchase of Five thousand acres of land made of our late Father William Penn Esq^r by Thomas Brasey since deceased who in his life time in consideration of two hundred acres of land to him granted in the Township of Chester and which are still held under the said Grant did relinquish his right of and in the said Lots of ground and proportion of Liberty land to the use of our said Father and also to survey for our use and behoof the Bank and water Lot lying opposite to the Front lot aforesaid near Vine Street at the north end of the said City and make returns of the Several Surveys to be made by vertue hereof into our Secretarys office there to remain for our sole use and behoof and for thy so doing this shall be thy sufficient Warrant Given under my Hand and the Lesser Seal of our Province at Philadelp^a this 18th day of Decem^r Anno Dom 1735.
