

Pursuant to a Warrant under the hand and seal of the Proprietary and Governour to me directed bearing date the 2^d day of the 7th month 1700

I do hereby certify that I have caused to be surveyed unto Martha Hatten Daughter of William Hatten deceased in right of James Harrison old purchaser a certain Tract of Land situate in the County of Philadelphia beginning at a stake set in the ground being a Corner dividing it from the Land of James Brook and Company from thence North East by the said Brook's Line of marked trees five hundred perches to a marked Hickery from thence North West by a Line of marked trees one hundred and sixty perches to a white oak dividing it from a Tract of Land laid out for the proper use and behoof of the Proprietary and Governour and of his Heirs after him, from thence by a Line of marked trees South West five hundred perches to a marked black oak from thence South East by a Line of marked trees one hundred and sixty perches to the first mentioned stake containing and Laid out for five hundred acres of Land Surveyed the 13th day of the 11th month 1700 and Returned according to the abovesaid survey and bounds into the Proprietary & Governour's Secretary's Office the 5th day of the 12th month 1700 P. Edw^d. Penington Surv^r Gen^l
