

Pursuant to a warrant under the hands of the Commissioners of Property and the seal of the Province bearing date the 29th day of 7th month 1702 for Resurveying the Township of Gwyned or North-wales

There is Resurveyd unto J^r Hugh a Tract of land in the Township of Gwyned beginning at a black oak from thence extending by Thomas Sidons land and other land south forty ~~five~~ three degrees and three quarters westerly eight hundred forty four perches to a black oak marked by the Reputed land of Richard Whitpatt and Comp^{ie} from thence North west by a line of marked trees one hundred and eighteen perches to a stake by William Johns land from thence by a line of Marked trees North forty three degr^s easterly eight hundred forty four perches to a stake sett in the Ground by Hugh Griffiths land and in the line of Joseph ffishers land from thence by the said line ~~south~~ South east one hundred twenty eight perches to the place of Beginning containing six hundred forty eight acres and one hundred thirty two perches Resurvey'd by David Powel and Returned into the General Surveyors office the 21st day of the 10th Month 1702
