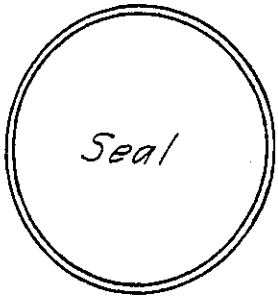

Whereas William Hudson of Philad^{ia} Requesting of us a certain Strip of Vacant Lots of forty eight foot in breadth or thereabouts & in depth the whole distance between the fifth & sixth streets from Delaware being a small Vacancy between the ends of the High Street and Mulberry Street Lots hath agreed to pay to the Proprietor twelve pounds ten shillings of Pensilv^{ia} Money together with Interest from the first day of November last to the day of paym^t and two shill^s sterling Yearly for a Quitrent These therefore are to Authorize thee to ~~pay~~ Survey and lay out to the said William Hudson the aforesaid Vacant strip of Ground Bounded as is above express^d and make Returns thereof being first duly entred in the Surveyor Gen^l's Office & into the Secretaries Office of this Province - Given under our hands & Seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 31st day of the 11th Moth 170⁹
