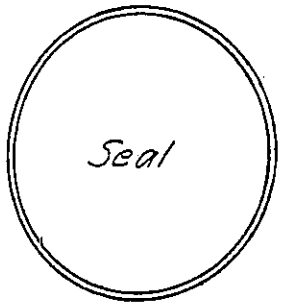

*At the Request of Robert Heath That I would grant him to take up Sixteen Acres of  
Liberty Land the Proportion of a Purchase of one thousand Acres made by Thomas  
Woolrich his brother in law, the right to w<sup>ch</sup> thousand Acres he y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Robert bought These  
are to require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be surveyd to the s<sup>d</sup> Robert Heath the  
s<sup>d</sup> Number of Sixteen Acres of Land within the Liberties of the City of Philadelphia  
where it has not been yet surveyd nor taken up and make returns thereof into  
my secretaries Office. Given under my hand and Seal at Philadelphia the 16<sup>th</sup> of  
the 7<sup>th</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1701*
