At the request of Peter Hutton that we would Grant him to take up Eight Hundred Acres of Land in this Province, for which he hath agreed to pay to the Proprietors use Eighty Pounds and the Usual Quitrent of ^{the} Shilling Sterling for Every Hundred ^{acres} _{of} ^{the} _{Land} ^{of} _{the} ^{Province} _{of} ^{the} _{Province These are to Authorize and require thee to Survey or Cause to be Surveyed to the said Peter Hutton According to the Method of Townships appointed the said Quantity of Eight Hundred Acres of Land in the said Province, that is not already Surveyed nor Appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians, And make a Return thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order to a further Confirmation, which said Survey in Case the said Peter fulfill the aforesaid Agreement within three Months after Location shall be Valid otherwise the same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever Granted, Given under our hands and Seale of the Province the 9th of ^{the} _{Year} 2^{mo} 1714 At Philadelphia}
