At the Request of Phillip Howell That We would grant him to take up Survey Rights of Head land belonging to Servants who came in at y^e first Settling of this Province purchased by Heirs of y^e said Servants To witt ffifty acres in right of Edmund M^o Veagh who came in Serv^t to Thomas Holme ffifty acres in right of Alice M^o Veagh Servant to James Harrison and two hundred acres in right of Abraham Pratt his wife Jane Pratt and their two Sons Thomas Pratt & John Pratt Each ffifty acres Who came all Servants to y^e Society of Traders being in all three Hundred acres under y^e yearly Quitrent of one Halfpenny Sterling P^{er} Acre These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey to y^e said Phillip Howell according to y^e Method of Townships appointed y^e said Quantity of Three Hundred acres of Land in this Province where not already Surveyed nor taken up nor is Contained nor Seated by y^e Indians and Make Returns into y^e Gen^l Surveyo^{rs} Office at Philad^{ia} where this Warr^t is to remain and a Copy thereof to be Deliv^d to thee certified by y^e Secretary Given under our Hands and y^e Seal of y^e Province at Philad^{ia} ~~these~~ 22nd 9th 1703
