Resurveyd the said Tract beginning at a black oak at a corner of Joseph Mather's Land Thence North west two hundred forty two perches to a post at a corner of James Williams and Companies Land Then by the same south west five hundred and twenty six perches to a post Then south East two hundred and thirty six perches to a post at another corner of the said Joseph Mather's Land ^{then down} the same Northeast five hundred and twenty Six perches to the place of Beginning Containing seven hundred & seventy nine acres
