

Pursuant to a Warrant under the hand and seal of the Proprietary and Governour of the directed bearing date the 15<sup>th</sup> day of the 1<sup>st</sup> month 1701 I do hereby certify that I have caused to be Resurveyed unto William Howel a certain Tract of Land situate in the Township of Cheltenham in the County of Philadelphia, formerly laid out for eight hundred acres, five hundred thereof to William Fraclipton in right of Christopher Taylor's purchase, and the other three hundred to Thomas Fairman claimed by him in right of a Warrant from the Proprietary and Governour, but now found to contain nine hundred acres and one hundred twenty four perches, Beginning at a Corner post dividing it from Joseph Mather's Land, thence North East by an old Line of marked trees running by the said Land five hundred twenty and one perches to a Corner black oak marked, from thence by an old Line of marked trees dividing it from John Roberts's and Samuel Cart's Land North West two hundred seventy and four perches to a Corner post dividing it from Jacob Telmer's Land, from thence by an old Line of marked trees running along the said Land South West five hundred twenty and six perches to another post dividing it from David Potts's Land, from thence by an old Line of marked trees dividing it from the Land of the said David Potts William Wilkinson and Peter Nair South East two hundred seventy and four perches to the first mentioned Corner post containing as above expressed. Resurveyed the 13<sup>th</sup> day of the 3<sup>d</sup> month 1701 and Returned according to the abovesaid survey and bounds into y<sup>e</sup> Proprietary and Governour's Secretary's Office the 20<sup>th</sup> day of the 6<sup>th</sup> month 1701
