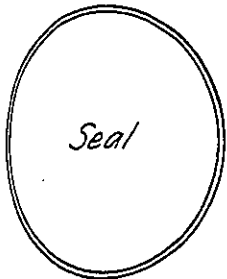


Pennsylvania

At the Request of Edward Smout of Philadelphia That we would grant him to take up one hundred acres of ^{head} Land. fifty acres thereof in right of himSelf and fifty acres in right of his wife Elizabeth Smout formerly Elizabeth Frigg who came into this Province Servants to Major Jasper ffarmer, These are to Authorize and require thee to Survey & Lay out to y^e s^d Edward Smout y^e s^d quantity of one hundred acres of Land, (Contiguous to his tract of Three hundred Ninety two acres granted to him by one Warr^t bearing date y^e 22^d 3^d m^o 1703) in y^e County of Chester where not already Survey'd nor taken up nor is Conceal'd nor Seated by y^e Indians, and make ^{Copy Del.} returns into y^e Gen^l Surveyors Office at Philad^{ia} where this Warr^t is to remain and a Copy thereof to be Deliv^d to thee certified by y^e Secretary. Given under our hands and y^e Seal of y^e Province at Philad^{ia} 24. - 3^d m^o 1703.
