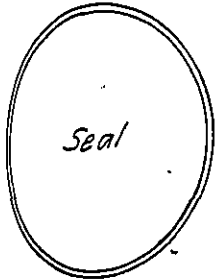

By the Commissioners of Property

Whereas John Rudolph Buttdelyn by an Agreement with the former Commissioners in the Year 1710 for himself and Company took up ten thousand Acres of Land on Pecquean Creek of which about eight thousand Acres have been subdivided and granted to several of his said Company And of the Remaining two thousand he has released his Right of one Moiety thereof to Herman Richtman late of Hamburg who has thereupon Agreed with us to pay for the said thousand Acres as also One hundred Acres of adjoining vacant Land to be added to the same after the rate of Ten pounds Money of this Province and y^e usual Quittr^s of one shilling sterling yearly for each hundred Acres One half thereof to be paid in Six Months and the other in twelve Months after the date hereof with Interest These therefore are to Authorize and Require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd to the said Herman Richtman One thousand Acres of the said remaining two thousand by a straight line through the whole length thereof and on the Westermost side of the s^d Tract together with One hundred Acres joynting thereto on the South end of the Tract and make Returns of the whole said eleven hundred Acres into the Secretaries Office Which Survey in case the said Herman fulfill the said Agreement shall be valid otherwise the same to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warr^t ever granted Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 22^d day of October A.D 1715
