 Thomas Marks and Vac^t Land ^{North 40 Deg. East} Two hundred Seventy five perches to a post thence by
 Vac^t Land South East One hundred and Sixty perches to a post on the line of Samuel
 Gulden land thence by y^e s^d Gulden's Land South forty Deg. West Two hundred Seventy
 five perches to the place of beginning Containing Two hundred Acres with y^e usual
 allowance
