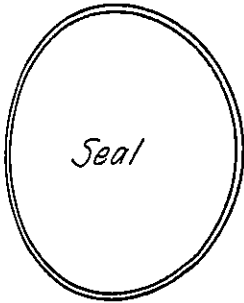

That we w<sup>l</sup> obl )nt firm (obl ) the Quantity of four Hundred Acres of Land in this Province in part of th<sup>l</sup> ) Acres purchased of the late Proprietor by Daniel Wharley - of London Dec<sup>d</sup> by (obl ) Lease & Release dated the obl 4<sup>th</sup> dayes of April anno 169obl whose Eldest Son and (obl ) Daniel Wharley by Indentures of Lease & Release dated the 2<sup>d</sup> & 3<sup>d</sup> dayes of April anno 172obl Granted & Released the whole unto the said Rowland Ellis his Heirs & Assgnes forever These are to Authorize & Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd in Right of the Original purchase aforesaid according to the Method of Townships appointed in the said Province the said Quantity of four Hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretays Office in Order for a further Confirmation Given under our Hand and the lesser Seal of y<sup>e</sup> Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> the 21<sup>st</sup> day of the third Month Anno D<sup>ni</sup> 172obl.
