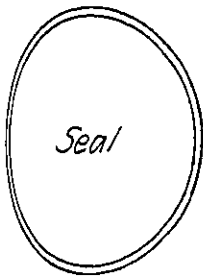


Pennsylvania ss

At the Request of Coll^d John Evans by his father in Law John Moor that We would Grant him to take up one Thousand Acres of Land in this Province first Granted from the Proprietor by Deeds of Lease & Release dated y^e 7th & 8th days of the Second Month in the Year 1682 unto Herman Hendricks of Rotterdam in Holland and since by Survey ^{mean} Conveyances the ^{Right of the} said one Thousand Acres of Land is now Vested in the said ^{Coll} John Evans These are to Authorize & Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Coll^d John Evans within this Province According to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of one Thousand Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make a Return thereof into the Secretarys Office in order to a further Confirmation Given under our hands & Seal of y^e Province at Philad^{ia} y^e 16th day of y^e 10th Moth: A. D. 1715.
