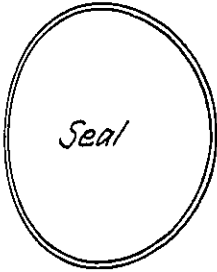


By the Commission<sup>rs</sup> impower'd to grant Lotts & Land's in the Province

thee forthwith to survey or cause to be Survey'd unto <sup>her</sup> a Lott at or near y<sup>e</sup> Center of y<sup>e</sup>  
City she fenceing it in & building upon y<sup>e</sup> same, w<sup>th</sup> six Month's, after the date of  
Survey, and make returns thereof into the Govern<sup>rs</sup> Secretary's office. Given at  
Philadelphia this 13<sup>th</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> 8<sup>th</sup> M<sup>o</sup> 1684.
