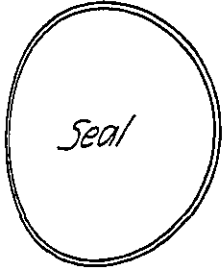


Pennsylvania

By the Commissioners of Property



At the Request of James Logan Attorney to Rachel Stammers of London Widow of Jonathan Stammers of the said place Original Purchaser of two Hundred and fifty Acres of Land in this Province That we would Grant him to take up two Hundred and forty Six Acres of Land in right of y^e said Purchase, Also That We would Grant him y^e s^d James Logan to take up for himself five Hundred Acres of Land by him purchased of John Budd Jun^r who purchased 2500 Acres of Thomas Revel Executor of the last Will & Testam^t of Elizabeth Widow of John Tatham alias Grey Original Purchaser of 5000 Acres from the Proprietary: These are to Authorize and Require thee to lay out to the said James Logan for the s^d Rachel Stammers his Constituent the said quantity of two hundred ^{and forty Six} Acres of Land that hath not been already Survey'd nor taken up nor is concealed nor Seated by the Indians: Also to Survey to the s^d James Logan ~~five~~ in right of the s^d Jm^o Tatham's Purchase afores^d five hundred Acres of Land in one other distinct Tract in the County of Bucks: Locating the Same on a certain parcel of Land adjoining on the Proprietaries near y^e Great Spring, appropriated to him in the Year 1701 by Tho: Fairman being not otherwise Survey'd nor taken up nor concealed nor Seated by the Indians: And make distinct Returns of each Tract into the General Surveyors Office at Philad^{ia} where this Warr^t is to remain: and a Copy thereof to be delivered to thee certified by y^e Master of the Rolls: Given under our hands & y^e Seal of y^e Province at Philad^{ia} 30th of 9th 1702.
