



There being surveyed to Jamie Logan Esq^r a Tract of Land on French Creek contain^g 1000^{ac} by Computation & confirmed to him by Patent a great part of the s^d Tract was reported to be poor rocky Land & such as no purchaser would have knowingly taken at the time that survey was made considering at what distance it lies from Town, upon w^{ch} the Proprietor consented that 700^{ac} of the worst of it should be cut of & released by the s^d J.L. who in Lieu thereof have 700^{ac} granted him in Conestogoe Mann^r. And to the 300^{ac} by him reserved of the 1000^{ac} there was afterwards added 200^{ac} adjoining and confirmed to him in part of 2000^{ac} in right of W^m and Abraham Lloyds purchases a Warr^t was granted by the Prop^rs dated y^e 24th of May 1737 to lay out to the s^d J. Logan the Residue of the afores^d 2000^{ac} (several Tracts having been surveyed & by him granted to other persons before the date of that Warr^t) & the 200 afores^d in part of that Residue was returned y^e 19th of Decemb^r 1737.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this Sixth day of September 1910
