 according to the Method of Townships appointed the said Two Hundred Acres of Land  
 & make Return thereof into Our Secretarys Office in order for Confirmation and for  
 which this shall be thy Sufficient Warrant Given under Our Hand and the Lesser  
 Seal of Our Province at Philadelp<sup>a</sup> this 19<sup>th</sup> day of Septem<sup>r</sup> Anno Dom<sup>i</sup> 1735
