Whereas James Logan hath made appear to us that he is possessed of a Right to Two thousand Acres of Land Granted by the Proprietor to Edw^d Bettris of Oxford Chirurgeon, by Deeds dated y^e 13th & 14th of 8^{br} 1681, ^{whose Exec^s conveyd y^e same to Hugh Lamb} As also of a Right to Two thousand five hundred Acres being one Moiety of five thousand Acres Granted by the Propriet^r to Matthew Marks of ffolkstone in Kent Carpenter who sold y^e s^d 5000 Acres to R^d Heyme of Londⁿ Merch^t who Granted one Moiety thereof to the ^{s^d} Hugh Lamb of whose Heirs the s^d James purchased the s^d 2500 Acres as also the afores^d two thous^d Acres Granted to Edw^d Bettris, and has thereupon requested us to Grant him our Warr^t for taking up the same: These therefore are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Surveyd to the said James Logan according to the Method of Townships appointed the said ^{ties} quantiti being in the whole four thousand five hundred Acres of Land (in one or more Tracts) that has not been already Surveyd nor taken up nor is Seated by the Indians first deducting the Proportion of Liberty Land appurtenant to the s^d Purchases out of the Same and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office. Given under our Hands and Seal of the Province at Philad^a the 30th day of the fifth Month 1712
