Pensilvania 55. At the Request of Thomas Rutter Jun^r of Philadelphia that we

would grant him to take up back of Manatawny the quantity of five hundred acres of Land for which he agrees to pay to y^e use of the Trustees fifty Pounds m^ony of Pensilvania for the whole and the yearly quitrent of one shilling sterling for each hundred acres. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said Thomas Rutter back of the aforesaid place according to y^e method of Townships appointed the said quantity of five hundred acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretary's Office which survey in case the said Thomas fulfill the above agreement within three months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted.
