The said land joyning to the tract whereon the said John dwells, for which said land and Island the said John hath paid in part to the Propriet<sup>es</sup> use nine pounds tenn shillings & is to pay the remainder at the next Philadelphia fair in November.

These are to authorize and require thee to Survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said Jno Reater the said Quantity of one hundred fifty-six acres of land & Island in the place aforesaid and make a returne thereof into the Secretary's Office in order to a further Confirmation. Given under our hands and seale of the Province at Philadelphia the 2<sup>d</sup> Day of ye 4<sup>th</sup> month A.D. 1714.
