Whereas there is a certain Tract of Land Scituate on the West side of Shuylkill adjoining to the Liberties of the City Philadelphia appropriated to my use of which Hugh Roberts has requested me to grant him to take up two hundred acres on purchase These therefore are to require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be survey'd to the s<sup>d</sup> Hugh Roberts the said number of two hundred acres part of the s<sup>d</sup> land between the lands of W<sup>m</sup> Warner & W<sup>m</sup> Wood & Sharlow adjoining on the land of David Jones and make returns thereof into my Secretaries Office Given under my hand and seal at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the 29<sup>th</sup> day of the 2<sup>d</sup> mo<sup>th</sup> 1701.
