At the Request of John Simpson of Tower Hill London by his Attorney William Allen of the City of Philadelphia that we would grant him to survey & take up the City Lots, and the proportion of Liberty Land appurtenant and belonging to the said original purchase of five thousand acres of Land made of our deceased Father William Penn Esq<sup>r</sup> by William and Margaret Lowther the right whereof being now vested in the said John Simpson

These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd to the said John Simpson within the said City where the same fell by allotment the Lots of Ground and within the Liberties of the said City the proportion of Liberty Land appurtenant and belonging to the said purchase of five thousand acres and make returns thereof into the Secretary's Office in order for Confirmation for which this shall be thy sufficient Warrant Given under my hand and the Lesser Seal of our Province at Philadelp<sup>a</sup> the 31<sup>st</sup> day of Decern.
