 Thomas Holme Survejour Genrall.

 his corner marked white oak from thence W. S. W by John  
 Knight line of marked trees to his corner tree from thence  
 N. b. W. 55 pertch by James Crafts line of marked trees to  
 his corner red oak from thence W. S. W. 120 pertch to a  
 marked oak by the Mill Creek side and along the Creek  
 side on severall courses to a marked oak from thence  
 E. 7 degrees northerly to a marked oak from thence  
 S. to the first marked tree

of Charles Ashcom. —
