(obl.) by John Bartram on the Front of New Market Street and it is con-
cluded that (obl.) Margareta be altered in its width from 50 to 38 feet
and that to make (obl.) Bartram amends for his Ground taken off by
the alteration of old Margareta Street and for the Loss of part of his front
on New Market Street It is ordered that he be allowed a front of 62
feet 8 inches & 80 feet on New Margareta Street and that he still
pay the same Rent as when he had the 80 feet front on New Market
Street.
