

Pennsylvania

By vertue of a war^t from y^e Com^{ts} dated y^e 24th of y^e 11th m^o 1690 directed to y^e Survey^r Generall I do by authority from him certifie in to y^e Secretaryes office that there was surveyed & laid out y^e same day unto Gunnor Rambo (old Renter) three severall tracts or percills of land in y^e Township of Shaktamaxunck and County of Philadelphia. The first peece or percill begineth at y^e mouth of Gunnors Creek from thence running up y^e severall courses of Delaware River to a corn^r post of Peter Nelson's land thence N. 16^d W^{ly} by y^e said Nelson's land 110 perches to a corn^r white oak standing near unto the afore said Gunnor's Creek from thence following downe the severall water courses thereof to y^e place of begining being fifty four acres of land swamp and Crible The second peece or percill begineth at a corn^r ^{Post} of Jn^o Tonk's land standing by y^e side of a meadow thence following up y^e severall courses of y^e said meadow 105 perches to a corn^r of Peter Nelson's land thence N.N.W by y^e said Nelson's land 177 p^rches to a corn^r tree standing by y^e side of a swamp or crible thence along y^e severall courses thereof to a corn^r tree of Robert Turner's land thence S. 36^d W^{ly} by y^e said Turner's land 58 perches to a corn^r post of y^e afore said Jn^o Tonk's land, thence S.S.E. by y^e same 140 perches to y^e place of begining being one hundred and three acres of land. The third peece or percill (being swamp meadow and crible) begineth at a corn^r post of Peter and Mickell Nelson's meadow and crible thence S.S.E by y^e same 104 perches to a corner post standing by y^e River Delaw^r thence up y^e same forty-one perches thence N.N.W. by a line of trees ninty-seven perches to a corn^r post standing on y^e fast land of Peter Nelson thence along y^e severall courses of y^e said fast land to y^e place of begining, being twenty-six acres Containing in all y^e three afore said tracts or percills one hundred eighty-three acres which is accordingly entred & recorded in y^e Survey^r Generalls office at Philadelphia.
