Whereas upon the request and application of Several of the Inhabitants of the City of Philadelphia who hold sundry Lotts of Ground on and before the Bank of Delaware River in the said City we have been pleased to agree with them for the releasing of a Reversion to us reserved on the said Lotts at y^e first Granting thereof. And Whereas the said Lotts have been since divided into lesser parts or quantities than they were at the first survey and laying out of the same. Therefore for the more certain fixing and establishing of the bounds and limits of the said Lotts of Ground. These are to authorize and Require thee forthwith to survey and measure or cause to be surveyed and measured all the several Bank and water Lotts of Ground lying and being on the east side of the Front Street of the said City and make exact and seperate Returns of every such Lott with their divisions as they are now held into y^e Secretaries Office in order for further confirmation and for which this shall be thy sufficient Warrant. Given under our hands and the Lesser Seal of our Province at Philad^a this 20th day of February Anno Dom. 1734/5
