

Land Office 9<sup>th</sup> May 1763.

By Order of y<sup>e</sup> Prop<sup>rs</sup> (in their Letter of y<sup>e</sup> 12<sup>th</sup> March 1763 to y<sup>e</sup> Secretary) y<sup>e</sup> Surveyor General is required immediately to lay out Vine Street where it goes thro' y<sup>e</sup> inclos'd Grounds at Springetsbury, viz; from y<sup>e</sup> Governor's corner on y<sup>e</sup> present Ferry Road quite thro' as far as y<sup>e</sup> Prop<sup>rs</sup> Fence goes westward, in order that y<sup>e</sup> Prop<sup>rs</sup> Fence may be moved & stand exactly on y<sup>e</sup> north side of Vine Street, and that all persons who are intitled to City Lotts on y<sup>e</sup> south side of Vine Street may build on them as they please after they shall have satisfy'd y<sup>e</sup> Secretary concerning their Title & got them laid out by y<sup>e</sup> Survey<sup>r</sup> General on a proper Warr<sup>t</sup> as usual
