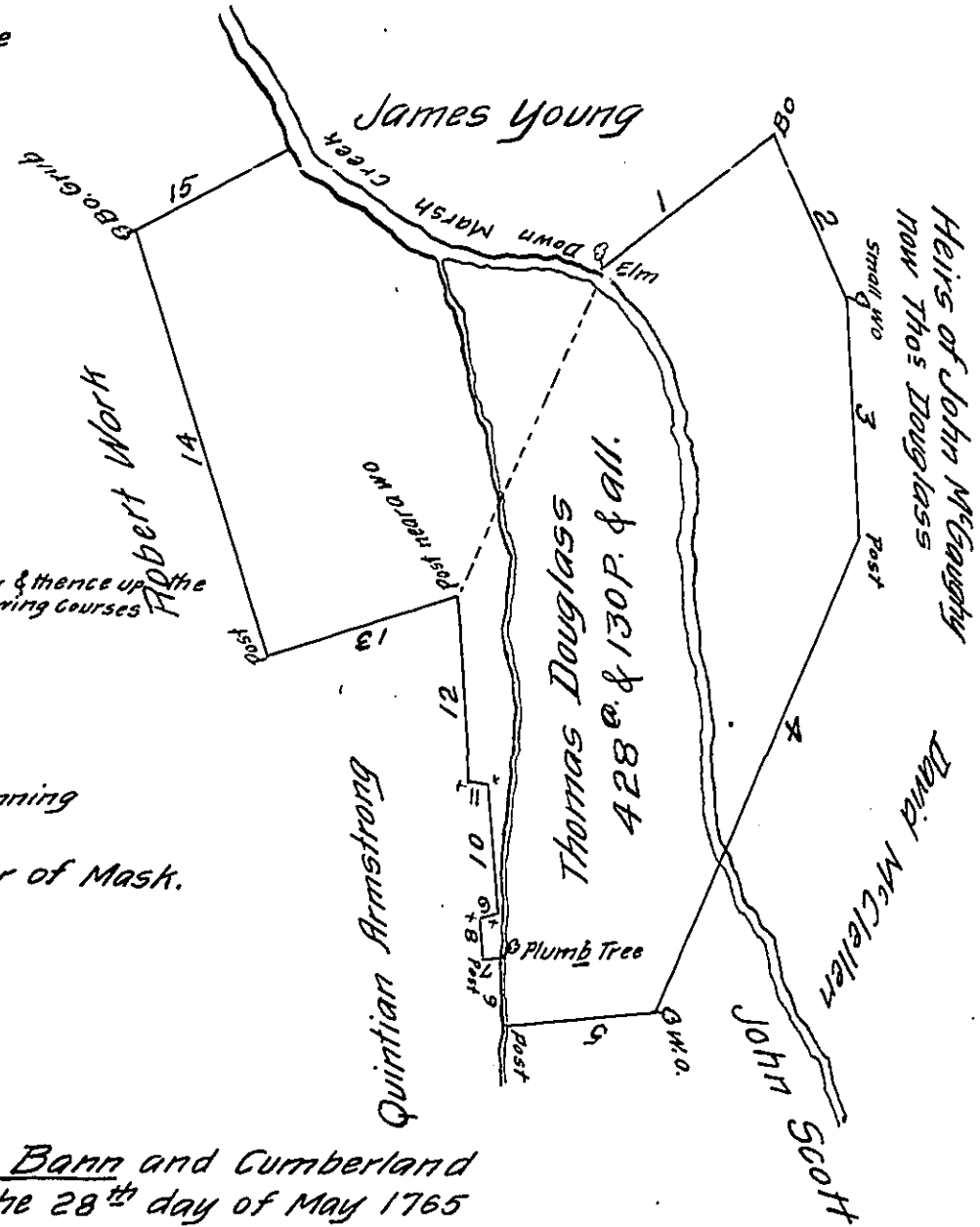


Courses beginning at an Elm on the West bank of Marsh Creek

Situated in Hamilton Bann and Cumberland Townships and surveyed the 28<sup>th</sup> day of May 1765 By Charles Lukens in pursuance of two Warrants in right of Willoughby Winchester and Resurveyed by the old lines By Moses McClean D.S. 1784.

Sir Being employed by Thomas Douglass to lay off part of the above Tract for his son Arch<sup>d</sup> Douglass; after running the dotted or division line, as Charles Lukens had not set down the courses on either of the waters I was under a necessity to run round the whole and finding the quantity on calculation to be 43 Acres less than set down in the Draught & not knowing whether he had returned it or not I have sent you his Draught with mine by which I hope you will judge of the propriety of my conduct.
