

Pennsylvania ss. By the Commissioners of Property



At the Request of Edward Roberts of the City of Philadelphia that we would grant him to take up in this Province the quantity of two hundred and fifty acres of land purchased of the Prop^r by Thomas Bayly of Bristol in Great Britain by deeds of Lease & release dated the 26th & 27th dayes of September anno 1681 who by like deeds dated the 8th & 9th dayes of y^e month called May 1713 granted & conveyed the same unto the said Edward Roberts These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said Edward Roberts in the said Province according to the method of Townships appointed the said quantity of two hundred and fifty acres of land (first deducting the Proportion of Liberty land) that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretary's Office in order for a further confirmation Given under our hands & seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 4th day of y^e first month AD. 1713/8
