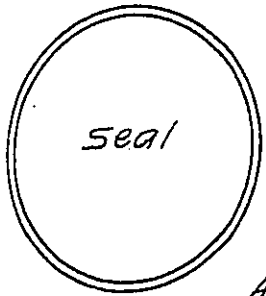


Pensilvania Ss.



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the request of John Salkeld that we would grant him to take up three hundred seventy and five acres of land in this Province purchased of the Proprietor by William Hyde of Acton in ye County of Chester Cheeshaeger by deed indented bearing date the sixteenth day of July A.D. 1691, and by Richard Hyde of London Haberdasher Son and Heir to the said William Hyde granted to the said John Salkeld.

These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed to the said John Salkeld according to the method of Townships appointed the said quantity of three hundred seventy and five acres of land in this Province that has not been surveyed nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretary's Office.

Given under our hands and seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 8th day of the first month A.D. 171 $\frac{3}{4}$
