



A Draught of a tract of land situate in the Manor of Springtown in the County of Chester now in the possession of James Starrett beginning at a stone on the South side of Indian Creek a branch of Brandwine thence by by land of John Jacks S. 81 1/2 E. 22 perches to a post & S. 2° E. 18 perches to a marked black oak thence obl. land of John Elliott's N. 75° E. 184 perches to a marked Spanish Oak thence by land of Robert McConnakee North 76 perches to a stone & N. 75° E. 53 perches to a marked white oak thence by land of Francis McConnel N. 22° W. 112 perches to a stone thence by lands of John Elliotts, Daniel Henderson & Thomas Canaday S. 82° W. 268 perches to a stone thence by land of Margaret Elliot, Widow S. 5° E. 192 perches to a Beech standing on the North side of said Creek thence down the same on the several courses thereof to the beginning containing three hundred & twenty one acres and allowance of six per cent for Roads &c. Surveyed the 5th day of October 1753 by direction of the Hon'ble the Proprietaries.
