



A Draught of a tract of land situate in the Manor of Springtown in the County of Chester now in the possession of Francis Alexander, beginning at a marked Maple standing on the South side of Indian Creek a branch of Brandiwine and from thence extending by John Hamilton's land south forty six perches to a marked white oak thence by the lands of Daniel Henderson and David McGanse South eighty nine degrees ^{and a half} West two hundred and thirty four perches to a marked Maple tree thence by ~~John~~ ^{James} Scott's land North sixteen degrees West one hundred and two perches to a post thence by John Potter's land North thirteen degrees East fifty seven perches to a marked Red ^{wood tree standing} oak on the said Indian Creek thence down the same on the several courses thereof to the place of beginning containing one hundred and ninety nine acres and the usual allowance of six acres $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent for Roads &c surveyed the 5th day of October Anno Dom-1753 by order of the Honourable the Proprietaries.
