



A Draught of a tract of land situate in the Manor of Springtown in the County of Chester now in the possession of James Murray, beginning at a marked Sassafras tree standing on the North side of Indian Creek a branch of Brandiwine and from thence extending by John Potter's land North six degrees East one hundred and forty two perches to a marked black oak thence by vacant land South eighty four degrees East two hundred and fifteen perches to a stone thence by land in possession of Moses Mellicin and land of John Hamilton South twenty two degrees West one hundred and ninety one perches to a post standing on the said Indian Creek thence up the same on the several courses thereof to the place of beginning containing one hundred and eighty two acres and the usual allowance of six $\frac{1}{2}$ of for Roads &c. Surveyed the 28th day of September 1753 by order of the Honourable the Proprietaries.
