



Begining at a corner marked black oak at a corner of James Spencer's land thence west by ye same land 125 perches to a post thence North by ye sd Spencer's land 160 perches to a hickery tree thence west by George Claypole's land 125 perches to another hickery thence South by vacant land 400 perches to a post thence East by vacant land 250 perches to a post thence North by ye land of William Branson 240 perches to ye place of begining containing 500 acres. Survey'd the 4th of 9^{br} 1708. *Isaac Taylor*

By virtue of a general Warrt for laying out for the use of the Propriet^r the 10th part of all lands &c. dated ye 1st of 7^{br} 1700 according to the primitive regulation for laying out of lands in this Province
 This land confirmed to Thomas Fisher and Peter Whitacre ^{who bought of W^m Henderson & Sam^l Black} see the particular Draughts.
