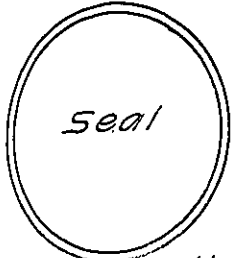


Pennsylvania, Ss.

Whereas there hath been heretofore surveyed to our use in Fallowfield Township in the County of Chester a tract of land computed to contain five hundred acres for which an agreement has on our behalf been since made with James Cockran & Stephen Cockran who have settled & improved on the same & having paid to our use a considerable part of the consideration money they now request our Warrant to resurvey & divide betwixt them the sd tract of land

These are therefore to authorize & require thee to resurvey & divide or cause to be resurveyed & divided unto the sd James & Stephen Cockran the aforesd tract of land and to make separate returns thereof into our Secretary's office in order for confirmation on condition that they shall fully comply with the above agreement within three months next after the date hereof otherwise the sd resurvey and division.

Given under my hand and the Seal of our land office at Philadelphia this 28th day of May 1741.
