that I would grant him a resurvey on ten thousand acres of land  
being part of a tract of thirty thousand acres laid out to St. Matt-  
hias Vincent & Comp<sup>ny</sup> in the County of Chester.

These are to will and require thee forthwith to resurvey or  
cause to be resurvey'd to him the said ten thousand acres, run-  
ning lines of division about the same and make returns thereof  
into my secretaries office.
