Upon an agreement made with John Reater for one hundred fifty six acres of land at the rate of twenty pounds  $\text{£}$  C. and for a small Island in Schuylkill fronting the said land at twenty shillings  $\text{£}$  acre the said lands joyning to the tract whereon the said John dwells for which said land and Island the said John hath paid in parts to the Propriety use nine pounds ten shillings & is to pay the remainder at the next Philadelphia fair in November.

These are to <sup>authorize and</sup> require ~~and authorize~~ thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said John Reater the said quantity of one hundred fifty six acres of land and Island in the place aforesaid and make a return thereof into the Secretary's office in order to a further confirmation.
