These are to Authorize and Require thee forthwith to Resurvey the S<sup>d</sup> Lotts according to the true bounds by which they were at first laid out and make Returns into the General Surveyors Office at Philadelphia where this Warrt is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delvd to thee certified by the Secretary. Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the 14<sup>th</sup> of the 2<sup>d</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1703
