At the Request of Joseph Pike by his Attorney Thomas Story
That I would grant him to take up One hundred Acres of Land
in the Liberties of Philadelphia In right of five thousand
Acres purchased by Sam^l Rowles of the Kingdom of Ireland
and by him Sold to ye sd Jos. Pike. These are to require thee
forthwith to Survey or cause to be Survey'd to him ye S^d
Joseph Pike the S^d Number of Acres of Land within the
Said Liberties not already taken up, ^{ory^t has been concealed} & make Returns thereof
into my Secretaries Office. Given under my Hand and Seal
at Philad^{ia} the 25th day of the 5th Month 1700
