our in Chief of the Province of Pensilvania and Coun-
ties annexed.

Whereas by Warrant under my hand and Seal to thee dire-
cted bearing date the twenty eighth day of the twelfth month
1709 I did thereby require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd
for the use and service of the people called Quakers of the
meeting and town of Philadelphia all those two tracts of ground
scituate on the South side of Mulberry street fenced and paled
in and now ~~by~~ them used for Public Burying Places according
to the present lines of inclosure and to make returns thereof
into my Secretaryes office which I understand was accordingly
performed on the twenty third day of the first month 1709 and
returned the 16th day of the second month 1701. Now the said meet-
ing haveing by some persons by them appointed requested mee
that the said returne might be renewed by inserting the names of
Edward Shippen and Samuel Carpenter insted of the people
called Quakers of the Meeting and Town of Philadelphia. I do
hereby require thee to make another return ^{thereof} according to their
said request into my Secretaryes office. Given under my hand
and Seal att Philadelphia ye 15th day of ye 5th month 1701.
