At the Request of Thomas Stevenson and Charles Brogden that we would Grant to be taken up four hundred and sixteen Acres and two thirds of an Acre of Land being two thirds parts of Six hundred and Twenty five Acres the proportion belonging to Thomas Barret in behalf of himself and Will^m Venables, of Eight hundred and Seventy five Acres Granted by the Proprietor to the sd Tho Barret and Tho Hecock w^{ch} Said four hundred and Sixteen Acres and two thirds as tis alledged was the proper part and Share of the Said Will^m Venables whose Heirs convey'd the Same to Andrew Heath who again Sold the Same to Thomas Stevenson: These are to Authorize and Requite thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd & laid out according to the Method of Townships appointed the Said quantity of four hundred and Sixteen Acres & two third parts of an Acre of Land in this Province that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up nor is seated by the Indians. And make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 30th of the 5th Moth 1712
