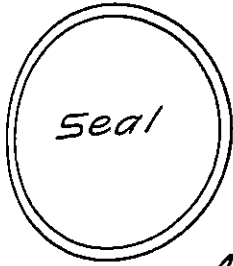


Pensilvania Ss.

At the request of James Shattick and Edward Lane of the County of Philad^{ia} that we would grant them to take up four hundred and eighty acres of land remaining untaken up of one thousand acres originally purchased by Sam^l Taverner of Lym-rick in the Kingdom of Ireland to which thous^d acres they have purchased the whole right. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd ~~the~~ ^{to} the said James Shattick and Edw^d Lane according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of four hundred and eighty acres of land in this Province that has not been already taken up nor is concealed nor seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretaries office ~~at Phila~~. Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the twenty sixth day of the second month called April in the Year of the Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eight & in the Seventh of the Reign of our Sovereign Lady Anne of Great Britain
