At the request of James Shattick that we would grant him to take up a town lott within the City Philadelphia appurtenant to the original purchase of five hundred acres of land in this Province made by Jone Dixon of the City of Bristol Widow to which said five hundred acres and appurtenances the said James has purchased the whole right.

These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd to the said James Shattick a lott of land in the said City on Delaware side proportionable to the said purchase as near to the original location thereof as any vacancy can be found and make returns thereof into the Secretaries office.

Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the twenty sixth day of the second month (called April) in the Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and eight and in the Seventh Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lady Anne Queen of Great Britain &c.
