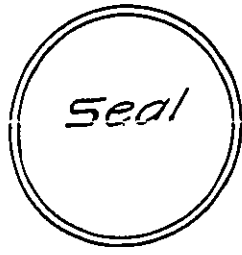

By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of James Shattick of the County of Philadelphia that we would grant him to take up five hundred acres of land in this Province originally purchased by Thomas Pagett of the City of Bristol to which said five hundred acres the said James has now purchased the sole right.

These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd to the said James Shattick in right of the said purchase eight acres within the liberties of the City Philadelphia if so much is to be found vacant there and the remaining four hundred and ninety two acres elsewhere in this Province according to the method of townships appointed of such land as has not been already taken up nor is concealed nor seated by the Indians and make returns ^{thereof} into the Secretaries office.

Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the twenty sixth day of the second month (called April) in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eight, and in the seventh year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lady Anne of Great Britain &c. Queen.
