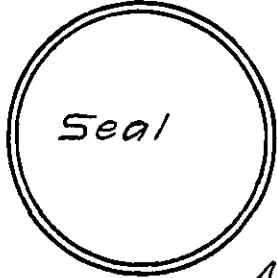


Pensilvania Ss.*By the Commissioners of Property.*

At the request of John Naglee of the County of Philadelphia that we would grant him to take up the quantity of two hundred & fifty acres of land the remaining moiety of five hundred acres the original purchase made of the late Proprietor William Penn Esq^r by John Millington of Shrewsbury in the County of Salop Baker by deeds of lease & release dated ye 14th & 15th dayes of August Anno — 1682 the right of which said moiety sundry mesne conveyances being now vested in the said John Naglee. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd in the right aforesaid according to the method of townships appointed the said moiety or quantity of two hundred & fifty acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make returne thereof into the Secretary's office.

Given under our hands & the lesser seal of the Province at Philad^a ye 30th day of Decemb^r. Anno Dni 1730.
